A few minutes after take-off from runway 21 at Beirut-International Airport at night, the aircraft crashed into the Mediterranean Sea. It is believed that there are no survivors. At the time, local weather consisted of rain and thunderstorm activity. The aircraft crashed about 3,5 kilometres off the coast of Na'ameh to the south of Beirut. It is understood that there were no survivors among the 90 persons on board. According to local media reports, in one of the last transmissions, the Ethiopian pilot requested to circumfly a thunderstorm cell whilst climbing through 8.000 feet when radio contact was suddenly lost.
